SELECTION

This year the selectors have introduced an updated "Selection Policy". This can be viewed at any time on our website at BBC-Selection-Policy-2022-2023-v2.pdf (bowls.com.au). There is also a hard copy pinned to the noticeboard near the bar. I would like to draw your attention to 3 sections of the policy:

Section 3 - Selection Principles

To treat all players with fairness and without bias or discrimination. To adhere to the competition 'Conditions of Play'. To develop players for the future as well as looking for success in the current season. To select competitive and compatible teams to represent the club in each Pennant Division to achieve the following defined goals:

- Division 2 win section final
- Division 3 finish in top 4
- Division 4 finish in top 4
- Division 6 develop player skills and finish higher than last place

Section 5 – Player Obligations

Respect the decisions made and understand that selectors are doing their best. Accept and play your selected role to the best of your ability. Players have 48 hours to appeal the selection decision by contacting the Chairman of Selectors. Players are not to raise selection issues with individual selectors.

Section 7 - Unavailability

Player unavailability has flow-down effects. Players should post any known unavailability dates on the noticeboard. If a player is unable to play, they may not be automatically re-selected in that division. If warranted, the player who has taken their spot will retain that spot.

If we can all pull together and give selectors enough notice of availability it will allow them to select teams on a Wednesday with minimal disruption later in the week. If you withdraw because you are unhappy with where you are picked or have another club related issue, please talk to a selector or me. A last-minute withdrawal has a ripple effect through many of the divisions, and in some instances may create a situation where we must drop the Div 6 team, this means 10+ people who want to play miss out. The obvious exception here is if you are unwell, as per the advice we have been giving for the last 2+ years please don't attend the club if you are sick!

Also, it is **really important** that all players lodge their voting cards after each pennant game and I encourage you to do so - it is important not to deprive one of your team mates of winning one of our prestigious awards by not voting. This of course applies to Saturday and Tuesday pennant and Electric Light. The cards are to be deposited in the relevant labelled box in the selection room. If you cannot lodge on the day, you can most certainly do so in the days after or even the following week.

COACHING - A Note from Dave

Your coach is now an 'accredited coach' with Bowls Australia.

The start to the season has brought mixed results for the sides but my message to all players is always; "focus on what you can control, practice with purpose and execute your skills to the best of your abilities". Remember there are many ways to work on your skills.

- Attend the Sunday coaching session 10am-12noon.
- Request a one-on-one coaching lesson (contact me to arrange a suitable time).
- Participate in drills (weather permitting) on Thursday training sessions.
